



London Geodiversity Action Plan 2019-2024

Proposed activities for 2019

Submit updates of existing RIGS/LIGS (GLA 03 to 59) for inclusion in a revised London's Foundations. Add the fourteen candidate RIGS and LIGS agreed May 216 (GLA 60 to 73) and four candidate LIGS agreed March 2019 (GLA 74 to 77). These will be consulted on via the GLA website. **Revisions and additions are to be completed by the autumn, ready for consultation.**

Convert 17 candidate RIGS/LIGS to public-friendly format and add flags to the interactive map on the LGP website.

Add flags for the 30 SGIs to the interactive map on the LGP website.

Add the agreed GAP 2019-2024 to the LGP website.

Six Potential sites identified that remain to be assessed plus a few new ones proposed including possible LIGS: Wimbledon Common.

Identified Bus Pass Geology routes and London views will be written up and added to the LGP website.

Lost Rivers will be assessed along with SGI sites previously listed but not included in the thirty 2017 published sites with a view to a second tranche of SGIs in due course.

Seven London boroughs have no geodiversity interest identified as yet (including Merton – Wimbledon Common); further desk research will be carried out to identify possible sites in other six (City of London, Kingston, Lambeth, Newham, Kensington & Chelsea, Westminster)

29 sites (GLA 4, 6, 15, 17, 20, 25, 30, 32, 33, 35, 37, 43, 45, 46, 47, 48, 49, 50, 51, 53, 54, 60, 65, 66, 69) have been identified that have not been inspected for five or more years; Thirteen others have ongoing planning, geoconservation or interpretation requirements (1, 7, 12, 14, 22, 31, 34, 38, 39, 41, 42, 44, 61).

Geotrail guides

1. Revise guide to the Spas and springs of south London geotrail
2. Complete geological points of interest on the Green Chain Walk '*A Trail through Time*', and an overview of London's geology and place on website.
3. Revise Thames Park Geotrail
4. Complete geotrail for Greenwich Park for the website (still requires permissions).
5. Prepare new geotrail for Spring Park.
6. Prepare a geotrail for the public around Abbey Wood and a talk about the geology.

Lead walks:

1. Hampstead Heath Geotrail during GeoWeek on Sunday 12 May 2019 with LNHS.
2. 'Anomalous River Neckinger' walk for the public during Earth science week on Monday 14 October 2019
3. Thames Path Geotrail for GA Festival of Geology on Sunday 3 November

Geoconservation work:

1. Riddlesdown (GLA26) on 5 October
2. Harefield post 1 September.

Continue liaison on Gilbert's Pit for an education pack using rock and fossil specimens. Also for Abbey Wood Visitor Centre, Highgate Wood, and examine the possibilities for adding geodiversity interest to the Bedford Park nature trail, Hainault Forest Park and the Epping Forest visitor centre.

Renew contact with London Borough of Islington with the intention of using information on brickmaking and fossils in the new Visitor Centre at Caledonian Fields.

Work with and the Friends of Barn Hill who are proposing to open up the view to St. Mary's Harrow on the Hill.

Work with City of London for Boards in Spring Park
